On Campus Classes Resume

After months of distance learning, Dar al Zahra students started on-campus classes from 21st November 2020. This school year begins with some unique challenges for students, guardians, and staff. To make the best out of this academic year, Dar al Zahra Schools have adopted blended learning where students attend three alternative days on campus as well as continue with e-learning. Primary one students started classes beginning of November to get acquainted with the school. The students have been provided with a reusable mask, school bag, stationery, notebooks, textbooks, and a set of uniform. Students have breakfast in an open area and are given takeaway lunch.

The students were provided with Sweaters to give them warmth and comfort during the low temperatures of winter in Najaf al-Ashraf. Dar Al Zahra School offers their sincere appreciation to The Lady Fatemah (a.s.) Charitable Trust (LFT) for their continued support in assisting us to uplift the orphans of Najaf, Iraq. This year, the school uniform sweaters were sponsored by LFT.

Dar al Zahra schools will continue to implement COVID-19 ministry protocols for the 2020-2021 school year to provide children and staff with the safest environment possible. Entrance sanitization booth, temperature checks are being taken at the schools, mask, and social distancing is being implemented throughout the day.
